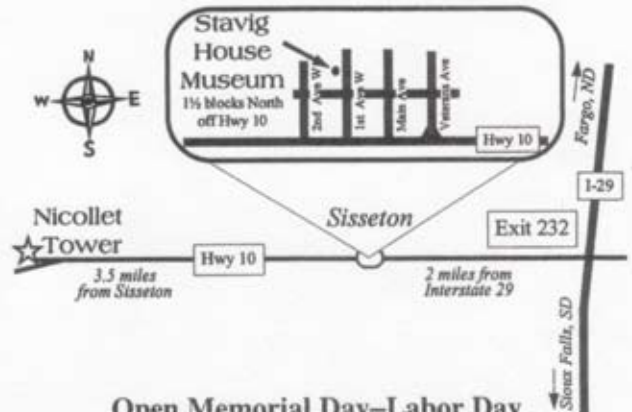

Tour the historic Stavig House Museum and discover the authentic story of a Norwegian immigrant family. Follow three generations of the Stavig family from fishermen in Norway to homesteaders on the Dakota prairie to Main Street entrepreneurs in the new town of Sisseton

The Andrew Stavig home, built by Scandinavian craftsmen in 1916, combines elements of the Victorian era with Arts and Crafts style of architecture. The house is listed on the National Historic Register.
